We expanded our operations across Africa and the Middle East delivering an integrated response that combined emergency relief, compassionate care, and long-term development initiatives designed to strengthen communities and promote sustainability.

Our efforts reached more than 40,000 individuals in Africa alone, while our teams led critical relief operations in Gaza through medical missions and emergency response initiatives prior to border closures. Across Syria and Yemen, we implemented more than 265 development projects focused on infrastructure rehabilitation, community resilience, and restoring essential services. Through our “Rahma’s Seven Pillars” strategy, we maintained a balance between addressing urgent humanitarian needs and creating lasting impact, directing more than %80 of our resources toward field programs

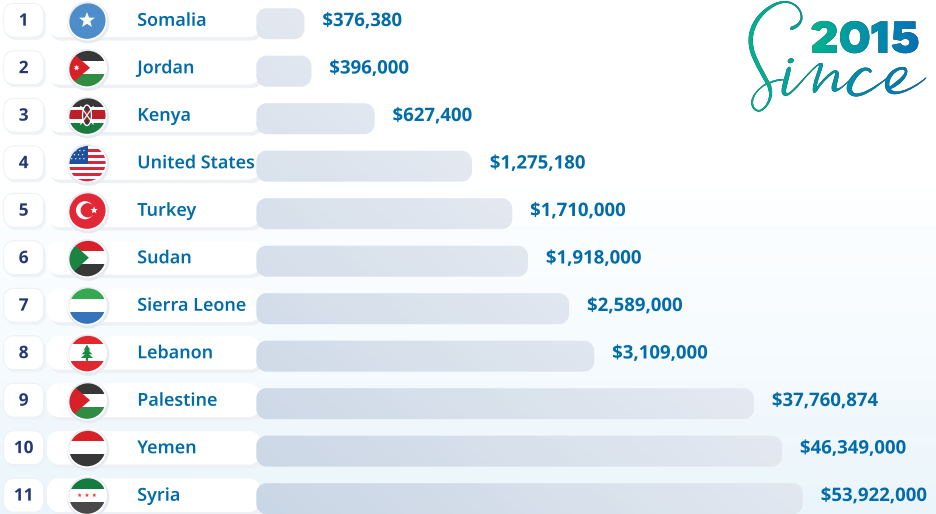

The Al-Mazra’a Bakery in As-Suwayda was officially inaugurated with an investment exceeding \$15,000 including a comprehensive rehabilitation of the bakery’s infrastructure and the modernization of its production lines. This initiative has strengthened local bread production and expanded reliable access to high-quality bread for thousands of families.

The restored bakery now provides critical daily support to surrounding communities while helping preserve dignity, stability, and food security.

Winterization

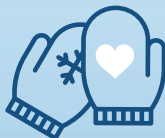
As winter conditions intensified, we launched our annual Winterization Campaign to protect vulnerable families facing freezing temperatures and inadequate shelter.

Giving Life Another Chance in a Place Once Marked by Pain

Kafr Batna Hospital in rural Damascus carries the scars of 15 years of conflict and the memory of a devastating chemical attack. In response to the urgent need for restored healthcare services, Rahma Worldwide launched a comprehensive rehabilitation project to bring vital sections of the hospital back into operation.

The entire third floor was renovated and equipped to receive patients in a safer and more dignified environment. The work included painting, electrical installations, air-conditioning systems, and the preparation of patient care units designed to support quality medical services and renew hope in a place once defined by suffering.

A Year In Focus

In 2023, we established our Medical Missions Program on the principle that access to healthcare is a fundamental human right that cannot be delayed, and our commitment to saving lives in the world's most fragile regions. Starting in Gaza, our efforts expanded to Syria and Africa ,areas where humanitarian crises intersect with a severe lack of resources. Our impact went beyond providing thousands of surgeries and consultations; it extended to empowering local medical staff and transferring expertise, thereby strengthening the resilience of health sectors in environments facing acute shortages

GAZA

Operating in the Impossible

In November 2023, amid one of the world's most severe humanitarian crises, we launched our medical response in Gaza. What began as an emergency intervention grew into a sustained mission, deploying 42 medical delegations and 466 volunteers over nearly two years.

Working under extreme conditions, our teams delivered critical care to the wounded and helped fill urgent gaps within an overwhelmed healthcare system. These missions continued until August 2025, when border closures forced operations to pause.

Although access was suspended, the impact of this work lives on in every patient treated and every life touched. We remain committed to returning as soon as conditions allow and continuing this vital humanitarian mission.

Muntha's story shows how one act of compassion can restore hope and keep a child's dream alive.

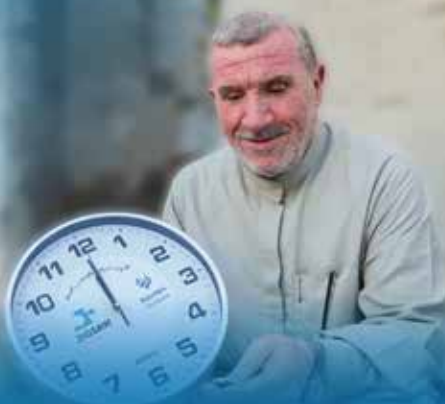


After 11 Years in a Tent, Abu Muhammad Returns Home

"Today, my feelings are beyond words as I return home."

For 11 years, 60-year-old Abu Muhammad and his grandchildren lived in a tent in the mountains of northern Syria, enduring harsh winters, extreme summer heat, and the lasting hardship of displacement.

Through our Sa'ee Al-Rahma program and in partnership with JIGSAW, Abu Muhammad was finally able to return to Aleppo and move into a safe, dignified home. After more than a decade of uncertainty, he and his grandchildren can now begin a new chapter filled with stability, security, and hope.





We believe a safe home is not a luxury, but a foundation for stability and a life of dignity. In 2025, we rehabilitated and rebuilt more than 55 homes in conflict-affected and high-need communities, including Yemen and Syria.

By transforming damaged and unsafe structures into secure homes, we helped vulnerable families regain dignity, stability, and a renewed sense of belonging.

More Than Bricks

Restoring Dignity After Loss

Through our “Joy of Victory” campaign in Syria, with support from Jigsaw, we reached Marwan Ghazi, a father caring for a family affected by loss, illness, and disability.

We transformed his damaged house into a safe, dignified home equipped with solar power, furniture, and heating. We also supported a livelihood project to help Marwan rebuild his independence and provide greater long-term stability for his family.

Rahma Emergency Response



In 2025, we responded rapidly to humanitarian emergencies, delivering food, shelter, protection, and other essential assistance to communities facing crisis.

In Gaza, our efforts provided vital food and shelter support to 276,740 people. In Syria, we supported safe passage efforts and assisted firefighters responding to urgent needs. In Sudan, we reached more than 11,000 individuals through food basket and meat distributions.

Latakia Wildfires

In response to the wildfires in Kasab, North Latakia, Syria our teams provided urgent support to Civil Defense crews, including **5,500 liters of fuel, 50 fire hoses, and 1,000 bottles of water.** This critical intervention aimed to bolster field capacity to contain the flames, protect lives, and prevent further devastation to the environment and local communities.



Sudan Emergency Response

In Sudan, our teams have continued their humanitarian efforts amidst the rapidly deteriorating living conditions and expanding waves of displacement. We launched a widespread relief response that included the distribution of over **9,000 food baskets, hygiene kits, and infant formula within shelter centers and camps.** These aid deliveries reached the most vulnerable areas in Port Sudan, Al-Jazira State, and beyond, alleviating the burden of war and hunger for exhausted families and providing a sense of security and hope amidst these harsh circumstances.

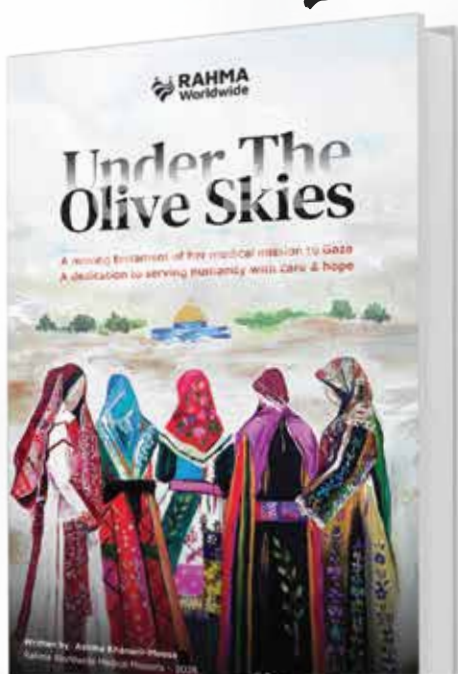

Ghiyath Matar.. A Man Who Confronted Bullets With Flowers

In 2025, we revived the legacy of martyr **Ghiyath Matar** through special screenings of the **Syrian documentary film 'Little Gandhi'** by director **Sam Kadi**, reopening a window into one of the most inspiring stories of Syrian non-violence. Fifteen years after the onset of a war that reshaped the nation, his voice returned to be heard publicly for the first time inside Syria, in the very cities that once witnessed the origins of his journey. The screenings spanned five provinces (Damascus, Latakia, Homs, Idlib, and Aleppo) where roses were distributed to the audience alongside his story. This created a profound humanitarian space where the narrative reunited with its people, in the presence of the martyr's family and the director. The resulting engagement breathed new life into the meaning of peace amidst Syria's recovery phase. This initiative was more than a commemoration; it was a powerful message that stories born from pain still hold the power to inspire a different future.

As part of our commitment to documenting the human stories within conflict zones, we launched the second season of the 'Rahma Podcast'. This season featured Dr. Mustafa Mohammed, an emergency physician and humanitarian activist within our medical mission—in an extraordinary dialogue that shared live testimonies from the heart of the war in Gaza, revealing the profound suffering and resilience experienced daily by civilians and medical teams alike.

The episodes also highlighted inspiring humanitarian narratives, most notably 'Love That Bloomed in the Rubble'. In this segment, Dr. Mustafa recounted the details of his union with his life partner amidst the bombardment and dire conditions, a defiant testament to the will to live. The podcast served as a vital platform for preserving the voices of Gaza and documenting their stories, ensuring they remain a living witness in the memory of history, untouched by the passage of time.



Challenges in 2025

Access Restrictions

Humanitarian restrictions created challenges on access and supply chain disruptions which significantly constrained aid delivery in Gaza. Our teams adapted by leveraging local procurement, pre-positioned supplies, and strong coordination with local partners.

Fuel & Infrastructure Shortages

Fuel shortages in Yemen and Gaza disrupted transportation and critical infrastructure, including hospitals and water systems. Our teams adapted quickly to maintain essential services whenever possible.

Security Constraints

Security risks in conflict zones challenged humanitarian operations. Enhanced safety protocols, staff training, and remote monitoring helped reduce risks and ensure continuity of assistance.

Funding Gaps

A growing gap between humanitarian needs and available resources — particularly in the Education and Mental Health sectors — remains one of the most pressing challenges. Long-term psychological recovery for war-affected children requires sustained investment beyond emergency relief.

Strategic Goals for 2026

- ◆ Expand sustainable livelihood projects in agriculture and livestock across Syria and Yemen.
- ◆ Double investment in vocational training programs — strengthening the ‘Beyond Relief’ model.
- ◆ Expand WASH infrastructure — targeting an additional 50,000 beneficiaries with clean water access
- ◆ Strengthen the Nibras partnership in Detroit to reach more refugee families with food, education, and integration services.
- ◆ Increase the number of mobile clinics operating in remote African regions (Kenya, Sudan).
- ◆ Launching 3D-Printed Schools Initiative - Phase II (Syria).
- ◆ Grow the Orphan Sponsorship Program to cover 1,000+ orphans across Syria, Yemen, and Africa.
